#### Important!

The maximum score the application can obtain is 100 points.

**The minimum score** the application has to achieve in order to be taken into consideration for possible financing is **70 points**.

In addition, it has to achieve at least 60% from each of the parts of the quality assessment, i.e.:

- at least 36 points from the strategic assessment and
- at least 24 points from the operational assessment.

Please note, that 36 + 24 = 60, so the application cannot receive minimum score under both of these assessments.

Additionally, in the strategic assessment, the **minimum score** for point 2. <u>"Cross-border cooperation potential and partnership"</u> (CBC criterion) is **12 points** (out of 24).

The project assessed with less than 12 points for CBC criterion will not be recommended for funding.
